# Wheels to Heal



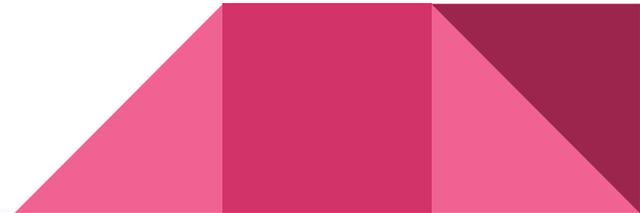
# Habitat for Humanity Partnership

Each community college can partner with their local Habitat for Humanity organization and help build houses for those affected. They can also seek help from the Habitat for Humanity store and obtain furniture donations.



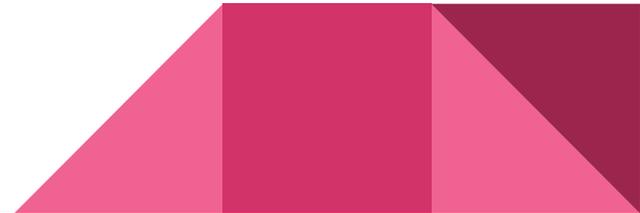
# Raffling for a Cause


# Serving the Need

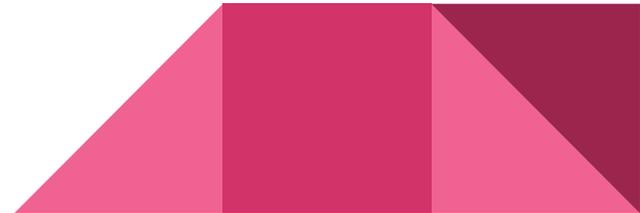
# Toys and Meals for kids with Feels
